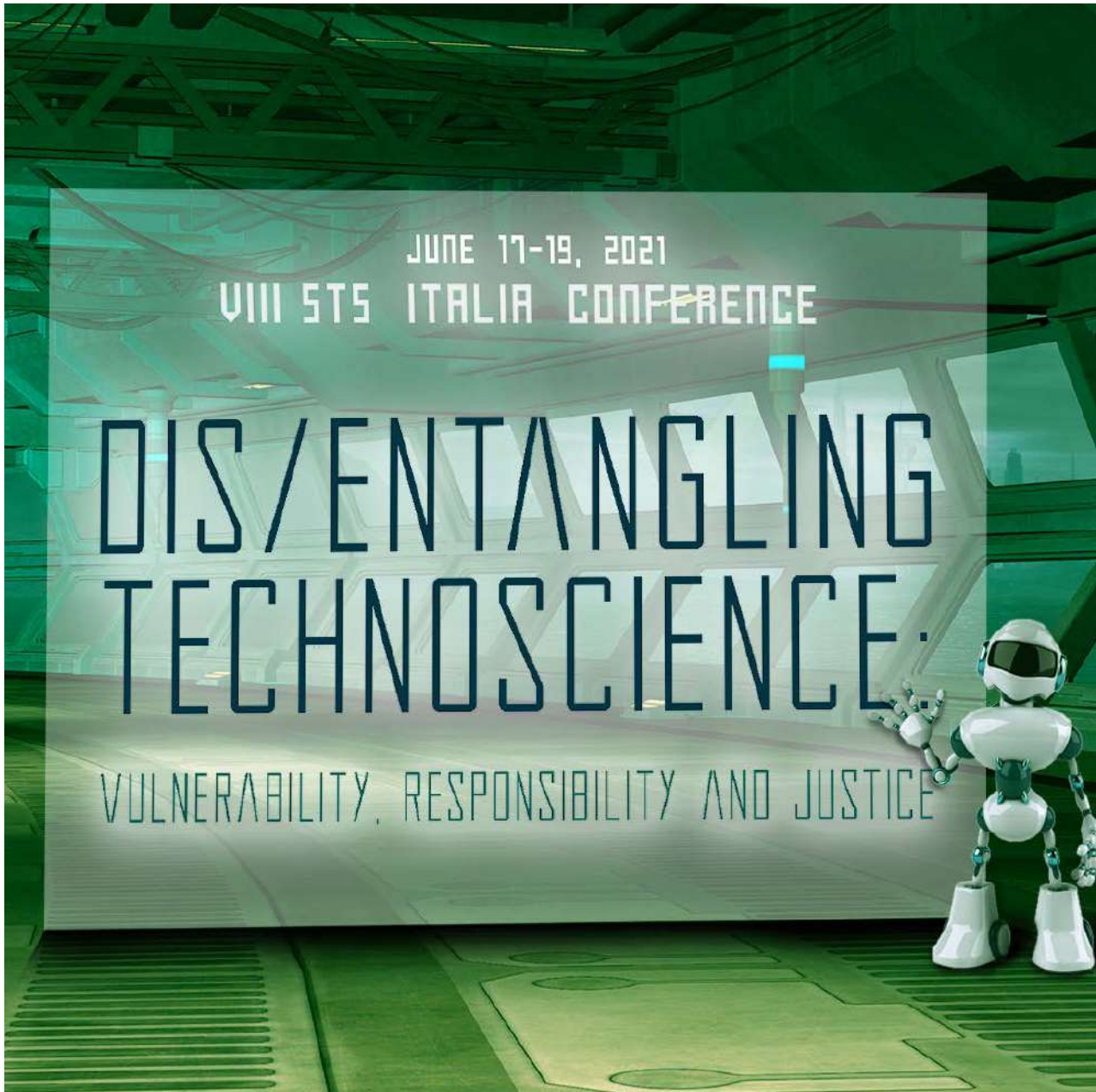

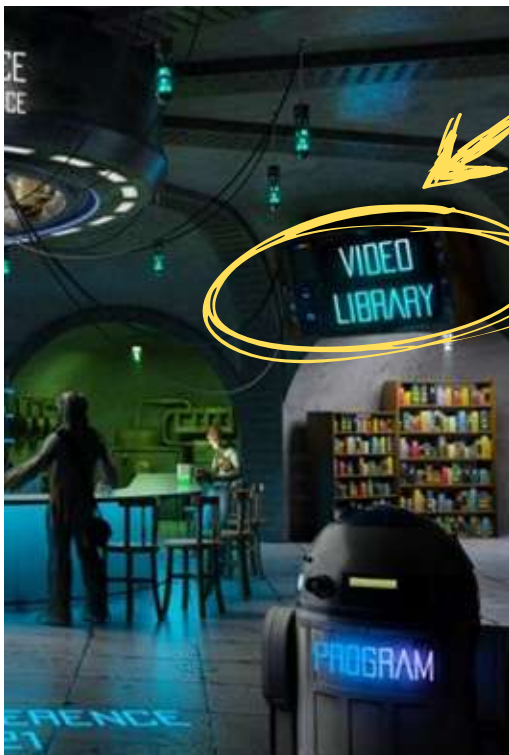

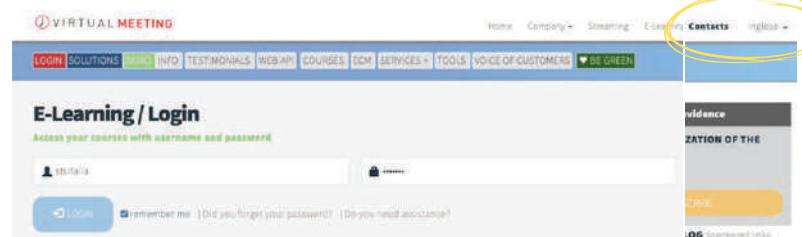

POSTCOLONIAL FLOWS AND FORENSICS AS AN ART OF PAYING ATTENTION

ABSTRACT

In this talk I want to narrate several stories that can help us grasp that magnitude of death and dying in the Mediterranean Sea. An attempt to narrate the crisis away, and to attend to the chronicity of Europe's ongoing (post)colonial involvement on the African continent. In these stories of encounter on the beaches of Zarzis, a town in the south of Tunisia, my entry point is (traces) of bodies that wash ashore. Traces, such as, worn-out sneakers and slippers, or clothing and toys. However, since the place matters, these traces will take us in different directions as well. Through a loose connection between a diversity of material traces, I suggest a shift and broadening of the notion of forensics. From a practice of delivering evidence about a single event, to an art of paying attention. The latter is a move towards materiality and material traces that could help us to re-configure the realities of death and dying and articulate the ambivalences and politics of persistent colonial relations.

Attending to death and dying beyond Europe's border management regime I argue that what we are facing is not simply a humanitarian problem but a political problem, one that implicates us in intricate ways.

RESPONSIBLE INNOVATION: A CALL FOR INSTITUTIONAL CHANGE

ABSTRACT

I will present Responsible Innovation as a new paradigm for innovation which is distinct from the current dominant market-innovation paradigm as well as from the state mandated and controlled technological innovation paradigm.

The Responsible Innovation paradigm is characterized by a widened scope of responsibility for the governance of innovation by public authorities concerning both the risks and socially desired outcomes of innovation. Responsible Innovation can only live up to its expectations subsequent to institutional change. Institutional change is required in:

- The way we conduct, fund and reward research and innovation practices: open research and scholarship
- Economic policy: addressing market deficits on delivering societal desirable outcomes
- Innovation management: public authorities must reclaim their role after decades of privatization, and enable anticipatory governance
- Regulation and ethics of emerging technologies: Shifting from an 'ethics of constraints' for emerging technologies towards an institutionalization of an ethics of collective co-responsibility.

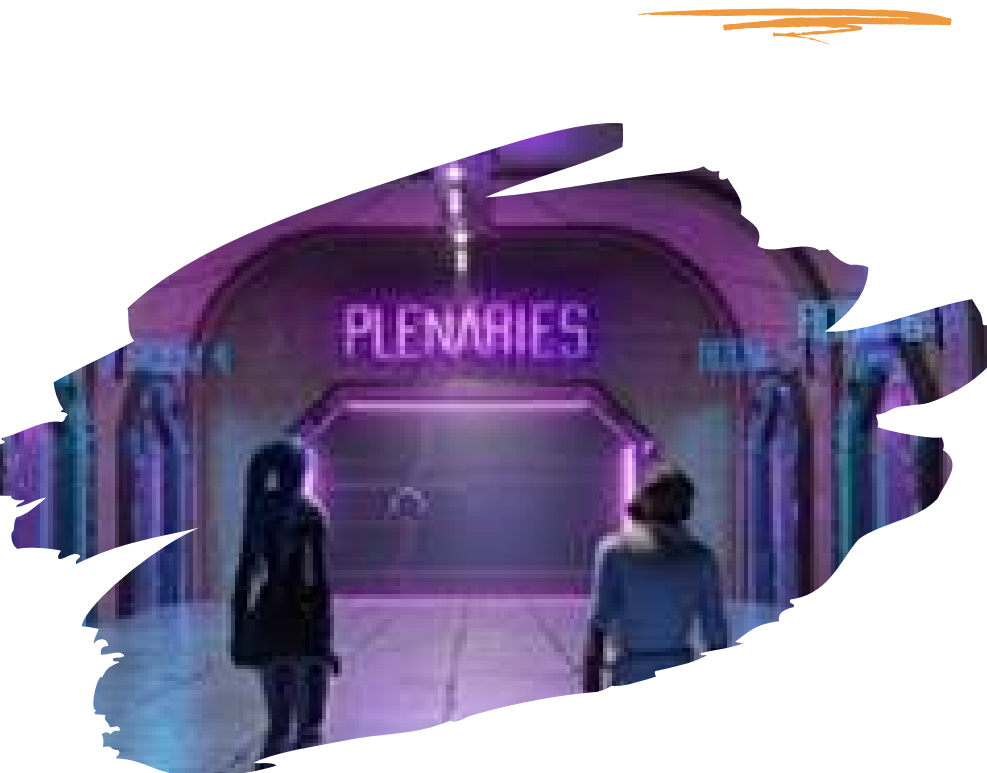

ELEMENTAL JUSTICE: NECROCHEMICALS, ECOLOGICAL REPARATION AND GENERATIVE CHEMICAL PRACTICE

ABSTRACT

If our worlds are unimaginable, or, ironically, perhaps even unsustainable without anthropogenic chemicals, what does it mean to live and navigate the toxic regime, this historical moment where human made substances are so entangled with ecologies and societies that envisioning a clean-up is no longer an option? Necrochemicals reign our everyday lives. They protract life and administer death. As life is becoming more and more chemical, chemical practice is becoming aware of its contribution to environmental destruction and its ecological embeddedness. Chemical practice becomes obliged by ecology. With obligation comes the quest for reparation, both as repair and as compensation for/restoration of the damage done. Instead of a chemistry as one single scientific endeavour obliged to growth and progress, ecological reparation involves a generative chemical practice that entails a multiplicity of many different ontological acts of ecological healing. Chemical practice becomes dispersed: From green and sustainable chemistry to the distributed invention power of amateur scientists, indigenous knowledges, remediation ecologists, interspecies collaborations, community technoscience. Striving for reparation of contaminated worlds is a quest for elemental justice: Who has the freedom to decide what chemical substances to create? And, how is this freedom achieved?
